

Establishing the Flood Relief Task Force

By the authority vested in me as The Supreme Pontiff of Hinduism and the Head of State of KAILASA, The Living Representative of Paramashiva, by the Constitution and the laws of Sanatana Hindu Dharma as ordained by Paramashiva in Vedas and Agamas, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. On 30th Sept. 2009, heavy rains resulted in major flooding, extensive structural damage, and significant loss of life. The destruction left behind by natural or human-caused disasters creates ongoing hardships and economic challenges for humanity. As a result of these events, hundreds of individuals and cattle were displaced, and millions lost power, some for an extended period. The loss inflicted on private and public property was immeasurable. Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh - two of the Nation's most populous States—were especially hard hit by these storms.

KAILASA's Federal Flood Relief Agency in the Department of State is leading the recovery efforts to assist the affected region. The magnitude of disaster caused by the floods merits a compendious and collaborative approach to rebuilding plans for this critical region and its infrastructure. The region's infrastructure and economic conditions must be addressed in order to bring these systems to a more resilient condition, given both current and future risks. The Federal Government of Kailasa bears the responsibility of resolving the crisis by saving lives and protecting the environment, especially during natural calamities such as floods. The Federal Government of KAILASA establishes the Flood Relief Task Force to provide the necessary coordination to support these rebuilding objectives and provide appropriate resources to support the affected victims.

Sec. 2. Policy. The KAILASA nation's policy that relevant agencies should, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, prioritize providing care and support to all victims of calamities by offering selfless humanitarian services through KAILASA's humanitarian agencies.

I am therefore issuing a national call to action to;

- a. 10 million peacekeepers of the sovereign order of Kailasa shall;
 - (i) Organize all human resources in commencing the flood relief efforts

- (ii) Work with all Hindus and citizens of their Nation, organizing under the flood relief efforts by reaching out to all citizens in providing humanitarian services.
- b. All seventeen nations of KAILASA – all Samrajyams (kingdoms), Samasthanas (spiritual kingdoms) and all their branches shall
 - a. Immediately start Annadaan (organic vegetarian free foodbank) services in the affected areas
 - b. Organize the distribution of critical materials for the displaced victims as clothes, medicines, and first aid material
- c. The Flood Relief Task Force shall immediately commence rebuilding houses properties for the affected victims
- d. Identify and work to remove obstacles to resilient rebuilding in a manner that addresses existing and future risks and vulnerabilities and promotes the long-term sustainability of communities and ecosystems
- e. Coordinate with entities in the affected region in efforts to

(i) ensure the prompt and orderly transition of affected individuals and families into safe and sanitary long-term housing;

(ii) plan for the rebuilding of critical infrastructure damaged in a manner that accounts for current vulnerabilities to extreme weather events and increases community and regional resilience in responding to future impacts;

(iii) support the strengthening of the economy;

Sec. 3. Membership and Establishment of a Flood Relief Task Force. The established Federal Flood Relief Task Force shall be chaired by the Secretary of State (Chair).

In addition to the Chair, the Task Force shall consist of the head of each of the following executive departments, agencies, and offices, or their designated representatives:

(i) the Department of Agriculture; (ii) the Department of Commerce; (iii) the Department of the Treasury; (iv) the Department of Health and Human Services; (v) the Department of Education; (vi) the Office of Management and Budget; (vii) Ministry of Sovereign and other agencies and offices as the President may designate. All members of the Task Force shall be full-time, or permanent part-time, officers or subjects of the Federal Government of KAILASA.

Sec. 4. Responsibilities of the Flood Relief Working Group. A Joint Field Office should immediately be established and submit to the Supreme Pontiff a report that outlines a plan for service coordination between all relevant stakeholders and executive

departments and agencies (agencies) to provide victims with access to free and healthy food and free care. This KAILASA's Federal Emergency Management Agency shall be responsible for submitting immediate daily reports with complete statistics of the number of humans served food and protected from floods.

Sec. 5. General Provisions. a. Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:

1. the authority granted by law to an executive department or agency, or the head thereof; or
2. the Director of the Office of Management and Budget functions relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
3. This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
4. This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against KAILASA, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, volunteers, or any other person, or against any nation's integrity or laws.
