

Gita Jnana Yajna for Empowering Hindus Through Pralaya

By the authority vested in me as The Supreme Pontiff of Hinduism and the Head of State of Kailasa and The Living Representative of Paramashiva, by the Constitution and the laws of Sanatana Hindu Dharma as ordained by Paramashiva in vedas and agamas, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. My administration and Kailasa recognises the need to make knowledge from Hindu source scriptures freely accessible by all Hindus. The Federal Government of Kailasa has prioritized resources in collecting and preserving Hindu scriptures. Our consolidated efforts have resulted in about 2 crore scriptures being collected, digitalised and made available on the Internet. The next challenge we are facing is in ensuring that the scriptural knowledge becomes experiential in the lives of Hindus.

Sec. 2. Policy. My administration supports educational freedom and we have been working towards the goal of making sacred knowledge from the Hindu source scriptures free of cost, to anyone and everyone without discriminating caste, creed and age. During this testing period of Pralaya (great deluge), the Federal Government of Kailasa feels there is no higher responsibility than to enrich and enreach the Hindus with the timeless truths from Bhagavad Gita.

Shloka 1 of Bhagavat Mahatmyam reveals that:

गीता-शाम् इदं पुं यः पठेत् यतः पुमान् वोः पदम्
अवोत् भय-शोकाद-वज तः

gita-shastram idam punyam, yah pathet prayatah puman
vishnoh padam avapnoti, bhaya-shokadi-varjitah

One who, with a regulated mind, recites with devotion this Bhagavad-gita scripture which is the bestower of all virtue, will attain to a holy abode such as Vaikuntha, the residence of Lord Vishnu, which is always free from the mundane qualities based on fear and lamentation.

I am therefore issuing a global call to action for all Hindus to:

- a. Engage the resources of Federal Government of Kailasa to facilitate Gita Jnana Yajna to everyone who is inspired, including by:
 - i. Providing an easy, seamless registration method through different social media platforms
 - ii. Increasing the availability of technology and facilities for online classes
 - iii. Developing educational measures to increase awareness on the need of Gita Jnana Yajna and how it makes the individual manifest the state, space, powers, being, superconsciousness and Kailasa of Paramashiva.
 - iv. Developing a training module to equip the acharyas (Teachers and moderators) by equipping them with the tools to cater to a wide range of students
- b. Increase the availability of Kailasa's services online by exploring innovative digital technology solutions
- c. Increase the accessibility of Bhagavad Gita books free of charge to all Hindus who participate in Gita Jnana Yajna
- d. Engage in daily recitals of Bhagavad Gita verses and internalise and memorise the sanskrit verses along with the meaning. The Sovereign Order of Kailasa is directed to implement this in each Kailasa to establish peace in both the inner world and outer world.
- e. Spread awareness on how my discourses on Bhagavad Gita (as the Representative of Paramashiva) can empower Hindus with the life solutions revealed by Shri Krishna in Bhagavad Gita
- f. Facilitate daily chanting sessions to awaken the higher intelligence of Hindu children, the future of the nation

Sec. 3. Establishment of a Kailasa's Gita Jnana Yajna Working Group. The Kailasa's Gita Jnana Yajna Working Group is hereby established to facilitate an "all-of-government" effort to avail Gita Jnana Yajna to all Hindus. The Working Group will be co-chaired by the Secretary of Department of Religion and Worship, or his designee, and the Secretary of Department of Human Services, or his designee. The Working Group shall be composed of representatives from the Department of Ministry of Sovereign, the Department of Enlightened Civilization, the Department of Information Broadcasting, the Department of Global Communications, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), and such representatives of other executive

departments, agencies, and offices as the Co-Chairs may, from time to time, designate with the concurrence of the head of the department, agency, or office concerned. All members of the Working Group shall be full-time, or permanent part-time, officers or subjects of the Federal Government of Kailasa.

Sec. 4. Responsibilities of the Kailasa's Gita Jnana Yajna Working Group. Within 24 hours of the date of this order, the Working Group shall develop and submit to the Supreme Pontiff a report that outlines a plan for service coordination between all relevant stakeholders and executive departments and agencies (agencies) to provide Hindus the access to Gita Jnana Yajna. The working group also shall propose a schedule of the classes (each class to be planned for a period of 15 days, ideally from Amavasya to Full moon) to be published in the government website and social media platforms.

Sec. 5. General Provisions. a. Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:

- i. the authority granted by law to an executive department or agency, or the head thereof; or
 - ii. the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
- b. This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
- c. This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against Kailasa, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, volunteers, or any other person, or against any nation's integrity or laws.
