

Providing Experiential Meditation Techniques to combat mental illness.

Section 1. Establishment and Membership. Hereby Kailasa is establishing the Dhyana Anubhava Commission. The Commission's membership shall be composed of not more than twelve members, appointed by the Supreme Pontiff, including members of the Sovereign Order of Kailasa, representatives from the ShriKailasa Uniting Nations for Mental Health and Development and Department of Health. The Supreme Pontiff shall designate a Chair from among the twelve members of the Commission appointed by the Supreme Pontiff.

Sec. 2. Mission. The Federal Government aims to provide an uninterrupted connection to essential mental health treatment and social support groups through the science of can be lifesaving, especially for the more than 2 billion Hindu adults who struggle with serious mental illnesses such as bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, or major depressive disorder. In carrying out its mission, the Commission shall:

- (a) Organise spiritual counselling workshops to enrich and educate the 2 Billion Hindus around the world about the importance of Dhyana Anubhava collaboration with ShriKailasa Uniting Nations for Consciousness Studies and Practise.

- (b) The Department of Education shall develop a manual for all inspired acharyas (teachers) to equip them with the right tools required to conduct the Dhyana Anubhava program for a wide range of interested participants
- (c) The Department of Information and Broadcasting shall enrich and empower the 2 billion Hindus and all of humanity to participate in the Dhyana Anubhava program by promoting the benefits of the program

Sec. 3. Principles. In conducting its mission, the Commission shall adhere to the principles below

- (a) The Commission shall enable the learner to experientially understand Meditation and its utility in preventive and beneficial aspects.

Sec. 4. Commission Decision-making. The Commission shall endeavour to make any decision on an action or determination under the direction Veda-Agamic principle with integrity, which shall be deemed to exist where no Commission member objects to the proposed action or determination. The Commission shall work directly under the supervision of The Supreme Pontiff of Kailasa.

Sec. 5. General Provisions. a. Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:

- i. the authority granted by law to an executive department or agency, or the head thereof; or
 - ii. the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
- b. This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
- c. This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against KAILASA, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, volunteers, or any other person, or against any nation's integrity or laws.
